

# NOTICE OF COMPLETION

Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Study

## McCowan Road Steeles Avenue to Major Mackenzie Drive

in the City of Markham

The Regional Municipality of York has completed a Schedule 'C' Class Environmental Assessment (EA) Study for McCowan Road between Steeles Avenue and Major Mackenzie Drive in the City of Markham to identify improvements to accommodate the current and future transportation needs of pedestrians, cyclists, transit users and motorists. Recommended improvements include:

- Widening McCowan Road to include transit/HOV lanes
- Improving active transportation facilities for pedestrians and cyclists
- Upgrading intersections to meet accessibility requirements
- Improving the bridge over Highway 407 for active transportation
- Constructing an underpass at Centennial GO Station on McCowan Road
- Providing traffic noise barriers where warranted and feasible

York Region has prepared an Environmental Study Report (ESR) documenting the study process, consultation efforts and the recommended plan.

Requests should include the requester contact information and full name. Requests should specify what kind of order is being requested (request for conditions or a request for an individual/comprehensive environmental assessment), how an order may prevent, mitigate or remedy potential adverse impacts on Aboriginal and treaty rights, and any information in support of the statements in the request. This will ensure that the Ministry is able to efficiently begin reviewing the request. The Part II Order request must be provided in writing and received by the Minister at the address below no later than June 12, 2021.
